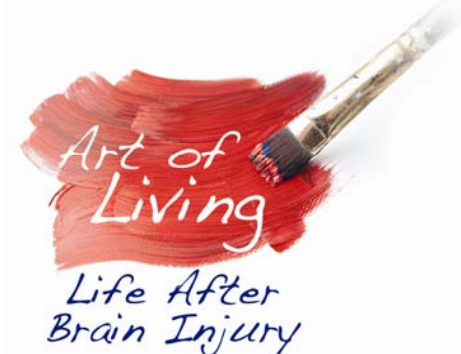

Before launching the Sarah Jane Brain Project in October 2007, Patrick Donohue ran a bi-partisan political consulting and fundraising firm which raised over \$500 million for various politicians, causes and non-profit organizations over the course of 15 years. Patrick lives with his four-year-old daughter, Sarah Jane, in New York City. Sarah Jane was violently shaken by her baby nurse when she was five days old, causing a severe brain injury and thrusting Donohue into the tumultuous world of pediatric neurology.
